



Paul Schmitz is the author of *Everyone Leads: Building Leadership from the Community Up*. He is also currently an Innovation Fellow at Georgetown University's Beeck Center for Social Impact and Innovation, and a Senior Advisor to The Collective Impact Forum, a joint project of The Aspen Institute and Foundation Strategy Group. Previously, Paul spent 21 years leading Public Allies, a national nonprofit that helped more than 5,600 diverse young leaders turn their passion to make a difference into careers working for community and social change.

Paul writes and speaks frequently on leadership, diversity, civic participation, social innovation, collective impact, and community building. He is a faculty member of the Asset Based Community Development Institute, and serves on the boards of Independent Sector, The United Way of Greater Milwaukee, and Voices For National Service. As a private volunteer, Paul co-chaired the 2008 Obama presidential campaign's civic engagement policy group, was a member of the Obama-Biden Transition Team, and was appointed by President Barack Obama to the White House Council on Community Solutions.

He was selected by The Rockefeller Foundation as a Next Generation Leadership Fellow, has been recognized by *The Nonprofit Times* as one of the 50 most influential nonprofit leaders in the country, and is a recipient of *Fast Company* magazine's Social Capitalist Award for innovation.
